



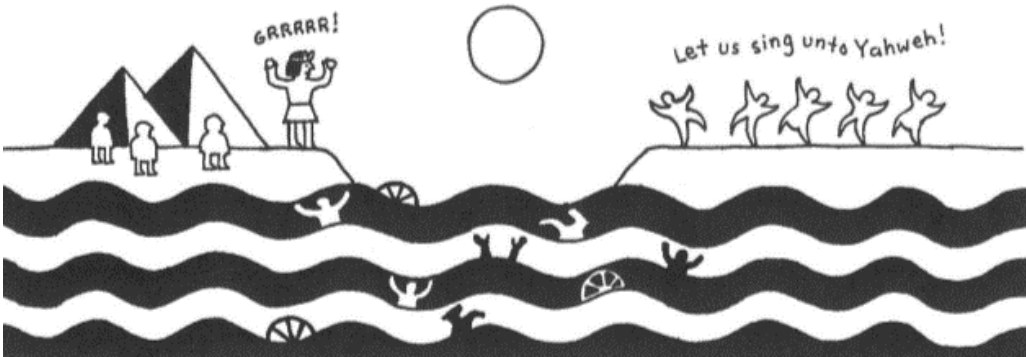

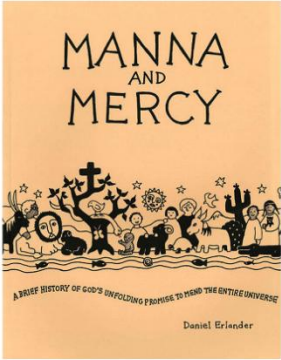
- Read Manna & Mercy pages 7-9

4. What does this scripture passage tell you about the relationships between God, human beings, and God’s creation?

Additional Questions to ponder:

- What did the Israelites do once they were in the desert?
- Why did they forget the realities of slavery in Egypt so easily?
- What was the lesson God taught with the giving of the manna?
- Why did some people ignore God’s instructions? To what end?
- How do we continue to ignore God’s instructions about manna today? To what end?
- What is the gift of Sabbath, and why is it so central to God’s yearning for God’s people?
- How do you honor the gift of Sabbath rest in your own life?
